Learning@Home

As we continue with students away from school (Alert Level 4 and 3), we will move into a more structured format for Learning@Home, based on what we did (successfully) in 2020 for lockdown. Key components are:

- moving to a condensed timetable for the day
- formalising the contact time (Google Meets) that teachers have with their classes
- teachers sharing their plans for student learning with parents and caregivers. You will be able to see exactly what your child is doing over the week see <u>Learning@Home Learning Plans</u> on the school website (this week's Learning Plans will be available by midday tomorrow.
- having an Ako time for all Ako classes.

This structure provides:

- plenty of learning for students who simply want to get on with things, offered through a variety of methods
- structure for those who still want to work in a 'school day', but students are **not** expected to be working a full school day, every day.
- flexibility for those students who want to work at a time that suits them (this was one of the key positives that students told us about when we returned from lockdown in 2020).
- lots of check-and-connect time, with class teachers, Ako teachers, and fellow-students, really important in maintaining those social connections.

In all of this, the learning for our students is less than usual, they can take longer to do it, have some fun as well, and do it at their own pace. The most important point is that they are connecting with their teachers.
